



The **International Landscape Study Days**, which the Foundation has promoted and organized every year since 2004, set out to provide people working in different ways and with varying degrees of responsibility in the field of landscape with a critical up-date of the latest developments and an opportunity for the exchange of ideas-

The various editions express in a coherent and balanced form features and boundaries of research and experiences – arranged from time to time on the basis of a theme that is as clearly defined as possible – whose purpose is that of guiding and possibly anticipating key contents and concerns in the realm of landscape. This is a constantly changing domain from the point of view of educational offer, cultural and social sensitivity, as well as the statutory and institutional frame of reference. This event therefore embodies the in-depth analysis and exploration that have always been a key feature in the Foundation's commitment – one only needs to think, for example, that its work began back in 1987, while the European Landscape Convention was to be signed in 2000 – under the banner of a distinctive feature. Its distinguishing focus on the necessary intermingling of different fields of knowledge – from garden culture to historical and geographical studies, from environmental and ecological issues to those of an aesthetic and philosophical nature – has produced innovative standpoints and breakthroughs on the tools needed today in the practice of landscape-oriented design. All that, with a mindset that departs from the rules of world-views constrained by the confines of individual fields of study and which, in the recently matured lexicon, refers to its interest in landscape in terms of “study and care of places”.

For each edition, some working documents are published on the Foundation's website www.fbsr.it and, as from the 2013 edition (*The study and the care of the places*), the complete video recordings of the lectures.

In some cases, a critical selection of the materials presented and discussed on the study days, appropriately edited and integrated, have been published in the Foundation's “Memorie” series, which collects the materials produced by the in-house scientific work.

The Landscape Study Days are devised by the Scientific Committee of the Fondazione Benetton Studi Ricerche, they have been coordinated by Domenico Luciano from 2004 to 2013 and since 2014 they are coordinated by Luigi Latini and Simonetta Zanon.
