The Carlo Scarpa Prize in Berlin, 18th and 27th November 2022

Press release 4 November 2022 The International Carlo Scarpa Prize for Gardens – research, study and publication project that ever since 1990 has foremost characterized the work of Fondazione Benetton Studi Ricerche for the landscape – is being presented in November in Berlin. This city, whose idea of *urban nature* developed in recent history, in particular with the *Natur Park* Schöneberger Südgelände project, is the focus of the thirty-second edition of the Prize.

Situated in the south-east of the Schöneberg district, the Natur Park Südgelände is the result of post-war abandonment of a vast railyard and its subsequent acknowledgement as a shining example of "Berlin's urban nature", a crossroads where the aspirations of local residents, contemporary landscape culture, artistic research and the manifestation of a profound and special ecological awareness for the city have all come together. The role of *Grün Berlin*, which now manages the area, the landscape planners of *Planland / ÖkoCon*, and the artist group ODIOUS have been key in the history and the life of this place. Opened to the public in 1999, the park marks the beginning of an immense field study that today allows Berlin to be seen as an ecologically conscious urban landscape. Starting in the 1960s a manifold constellation of places has given rise to a precise idea of "urban nature", inextricably linked with the political and social history of this European capital and the early, dynamic existence of a "school of urban ecology", which guides, without inhibiting, a design and planning vivacity and a widespread awareness of the landscape and the living environment of the city.
